About Me

Hi! My name is Dilsha Appu-Hennadi, I am in my 2nd year of Aerospace Engineering, in the electronics stream, and I am running to be your next VP Academic in the Carleton Student Engineering Society (CSES). During my time here at Carleton, I have held a number of directorships with CSES and I am currently the VP Internal for the Carleton University EngiQueers.

Carleton Engineering Competition

The Carleton Engineering Competition, or C-Eng-C, is an annual competition run by CSES with various categories for engineering students to compete in for a chance to qualify for the Ontario Engineering Competition (OEC). Traditionally, C-Eng-C competitions have been spread out over a number of weekends with about two or three competitions taking place over a single weekend consecutively. However, OEC typically runs over one weekend with competitions running concurrently. Thus, if I were to be elected as the next VP Academic I would like to run C-Eng-C over a single weekend to better simulate OEC. I would use whatever method of communication is most convenient for OEC delegates to ensure lines of communication are maintained during training and registration for OEC. Additionally, I would ask for feedback from OEC delegates after they've attended OEC to see how C-Eng-C could be further improved to better simulate and prepare future delegates for OEC.

National Engineering Month (NEM)

While continuing with events that have been successful in the past, as VP Academic I would also like to collaborate with the various stream societies to organize stream specific events/workshops to host throughout the month. I'd also like to offer a NEM sweater order, while I'm currently looking at quarter zips, I am open to other options if they are more preferred.

Workshops

If I were elected to be the next VP Academic, I would work closely with the workshop directors to ensure workshops are being organized efficiently and advertised effectively. I'd actively try and gather direct feedback from workshop attendees to consistently improve upon workshops as the year progresses. This may include how workshops could be better advertised, how to make workshops more engaging, elements of the workshop to continue, improve upon, or discontinue, etc. Additionally, as VP Academic, I'd try to continue collaborating with other engineering societies to host a variety of workshops targeted at different audiences.

Academic Advocacy

As VP Academic, I would like to help undergraduate engineering students address complaints effectively. While there is a formal complaint form on the CSES website, I would try to make more students aware of it by, for example, making monthly social media posts with a link to the form, making mentions of it in the Iron Times and the e-newsletter, etc. I would also try and inform people of how academic complaints may be addressed by running a workshop. Finally, I would work with the CASG coordinator and CASG VP Academic to effectively address students' academic complaints.

1. REBRANDING OF C-ENG MERCH
