






Well C-Eng, that's my spiel on how to get through the second semester! Hopefully this works for you, or you find something else that works! See you out there!

Ottawa is a fantastic city with a lot of great, diverse neighbourhoods that each offer their own charm, and some not-so-great neighbourhoods that you should avoid at all costs (Vanier, I'm talking about you). Luckily for you, OCtranspo – while infinitely unreliable – gives quite a few options for Carleton students to live within an easy trek to campus. To pick are few, there are the Glebe, Old Ottawa South, South Keys, Hogs Back, Centertown, Byward Market, and Little Italy.

The first four are where you should live if you want to avoid students from uOttawa;


those neighbourhoods are Carleton-specific (our versions of their Sandy Hill). As a former uOttawa student, I can tell you that I never stepped foot in Hogs Back before making the infinitely wise choice to switch to Carleton. The Glebe is a great neighbourhood, with big, old houses, trendy restaurants, and most importantly: Marble Slab. In this neighbourhood you can enjoy the convenience of Metro Glebe, along with other smaller markets for all your food needs, and a quick bus ride via the 4 or 7 to Carleton. It is also fairly accessible in terms of visiting other areas of Ottawa, as you can take the 4, 7 or 1 towards the Rideau center. Also, Lansdowne is close, so that's fun. VIP movie anyone? Old Ottawa South is the Glebe's southern neighbour, with many of the same conveniences. The same bus routes will take you to school or deeper into the city, but here you'll have a slightly shorter walk to campus, and the deliciousness of gelato at Stella Luna. House of Targ is also fun, because everyone likes perogies and pinball. Basically it's just the Glebe's less

pretty sister; all the basics are there but it's never quite mastered the art of make-up. Both of the above neighbourhoods have quick access to the canal and the bike paths along it, so if you're someone who wants to bike or skate to campus, these are great options for you.

South Keys and Hogs Back are great if you want to live somewhere that feels like you never left your parents house. These neighbourhoods are where you will find full houses to rent for you and 5 of your closest friends. You can enjoy the convenience of dishwashers that no one ever empties and laundry that you don't have to pay for. South Keys, while the sketchier of the two options, has certain conveniences you may prefer. There is the South Keys shopping area, with Walmart, Loblaws, and all those kinds of stores (also a crappy movie theatre, definitely not VIP). South Keys is also located on the transitway, meaning the 97 and 98 can take you directly downtown, and the O-train can take you to school. Hogs Back has the 86, which is surprisingly convenient but doesn't run

very late (12:30 on weekends), and the 111 that can take you to Carleton by the longest possible route, or not at all on weekends. For all of your food necessities, there's the trusty Farmer's Pick (so I've been told) and, more importantly, there's a Baskin Robin's. Like many who've chosen the convenience of downtown, I've only ever ventured into this suburbia for house parties, and have been forced to Uber home due to the lack of late night busses.

Centertown is great. Centertown lies between Bronson and Bank, and the 417. It's a really convenient place to live, but it's also a pricey. Everything you need is within walking distance, including bars, grocery stores, restaurants, and board game cafes (well just the one, but it's the only one that matters). Transit-wise, it's a great place to be. Carleton is about 10-15 minutes away on the 4, or double that on the 7 because it does a dumb loop around Old Ottawa South, and Bank Street is just so slow. At most you'll be a 15-minute walk from the transitway, giving you access to every major bus route in the

city.

The Market is a good place to live if you want to be drunk, always. Or if you just enjoy the hustle and bustle of the city's core. With Rideau Station, you have access to the 4 and 7, but they'll take longer than if you were anywhere else on their route. One important point is that this area is under major construction, for the Light Rail and the revamping of the Rideau Centre, which makes it a little congested for bus-catching. These construction projects seem to have no foreseen end date. If you're super eager, you can take the canal via skates or bike or whatever up to Carleton. It's about 7.8 km. The Market has Menchies, which is tasty, but let's not kid ourselves: frozen yogurt < ice cream. And of course, there are grocery and booze stores, all within walking distance. The thing about the market is there's always something going on, somewhere to go, something to eat, some drunk girl throwing up in front of your door. Really, the possibilities are endless. Here, along with noisier streets, you'll find higher rent prices. Also note, if you're someone who is easily bothered or frightened by people asking for things on the street, the Market is not the place for you.

Last but not least we have Little Italy. This is quite a fun neighbourhood, with some excellent places to eat and drink (read: Pub Italia). It also has the Carleton benefit of access to an O-train stop, or if you're feeling adventurous in the winter, a quick skate across Dow's Lake. Little Italy and Chinatown (the area between Little Italy and Centertown) are where you're likely to find the cheapest downtown rent, but maybe not for long, considering they're putting up some condos. The 85 is the main bus route and it will bring you up to Lebreton where you can get to basically anywhere else.

There are tons of neighbourhoods in Ottawa that you could pick for your new home, and all of them will have their own benefits. Just remember, if you want to follow the golden rule of Frosh Week – "don't get dead" – avoid Vanier and Lowertown. Lowertown Brewery, however, needs not be avoided; it's a pretty good place.

INSTRUCTIONS TO AN ORIGAMI ROSE:

STEP 1: Start with a square piece of paper, and fold it diagonally and sideways all on one side of the paper like in fig.1;

STEP 2: Fold all four edges to the centre, as shown in fig 2;

STEP 3: Now take an edge and fold it to the third line from your edge, and repeat for all four sides until you get fig.3;








STEP 4: Next, fold back your last fold (the edge to the third line) and fold in the bottom right corner to the first line, and then fold the top right corner of your bottom half to INWARDS to the line (see fig.4). Repeat for all sides.

STEP 5: Now you should have something like fig 5. Next, you're gonna take a corner, and fold it up to the line in the middle of the opposite corner (The red dot on fig. 5), as shown in fig. 6. Repeat for all sides.




STEP 6: once you're done that, you should have something like fig 7.

Step 7: Now you just fold in all the creases you made and TA DA! You got yourself a pretty little rose!






STEP 18: Push in on the center of the edges of the square where the perpendicular lines meet, and you'll get fig 31!

STEP 19: Pinch the peak at the center and twist it into the base (fig 32)

STEP 20: AND VOLA! You've got yourself the most frustrating thing to make for the first time origami rose!

Hope you enjoyed yourself and that whoever you're giving it to loves it too. If you experience any distress or anger while making this rose, please don't hurt me. As a method to de-stress, feel free to rip up the paper or proceed to ball it up and throw it at someone (not me).

REAL STEP 7: Now it's going to get complicated. Fold in the corners like in fig 8, and then pop in and fold the little triangle on the edge like in fig 9.

STEP 8: now fold that flap you just made on the red line towards the green line (as shown in fig 10-11)

STEP 9: After that, fold the entire green line onto the blue

line like in fig 12. You should get something like fig 13. Repeat for all four sides, the center square should pop up like fig 14.

STEP 10: Now carefully wrap up the sides just so the square pops up, making sure the flaps overlap each other in the same direction as shown in fig 15.

STEP 11: Turn the thing on its side and you have fig 16! While still holding its shape, fold in at the red line to inside the green pocket like in figure 17-18.

STEP 12: next, fold in the little triangle at the bottom in half (fig 19), open the triangle and push the corner inside (fig

20) (Red edges are the same edge, before and after shot).

STEP 13: While carefully keeping the square shape, repeat step 12 for all four sides. You should end up with something like fig 21.

STEP 14: Starting from fig 22, you want to pull that bottom edge (Red line) up so that the angled edge lines up with the top edge (Green line) see fig 23-24. (Try to keep it square shaped and overlapped)


STEP 15: You should now have something like fig 25. Repeat for all four sides.

STEP 16: Now you basically have cube with legs (fig 26). We're going to tuck those legs in like in fig 27-28.

STEP 17: KEEP GOING YOU'RE ALMOST THERE! (if you made it this far without crying or tearing up your paper, great job because this shit is hard). What you have now is a cube. Next is pulling out the pedals of your rose. So flip you cube so that the legs are at the bottom, and pull gently on the bottom flaps (if they hadn't fallen out already like in fog 29-30.


This year, NEW looks to

COOL PATCH, BRO

A how-to article explaining the way to properly ask for patches

As engineers, we all know how awkward we can be. From the way we were standing, to the way we speak and move our hands, its all bad in front of new people. In the first week of January I was given the opportunity to go to the CFES* Congress conference in Calgary. This conference was all about engineering professionalism, and had many presentations on how to be a better engineer. One presentation that struck me the most was pretty much entitled "How not to be awkward in front of other people".
